- Ramp for wheelchair access
- The building is entirely barrier-free and is equipped with automatic doors and a lift

Our aim here at Kempten Museum in the Zumstein House is to arouse your curiosity and interest in the history and stories of our city and its people. The museum is designed as an open and interactive space where visitors can get involved and discuss what they see. It also presents over 2,000 years of Kempten's history in an interesting and engaging way. Welcome to the city's new living room!

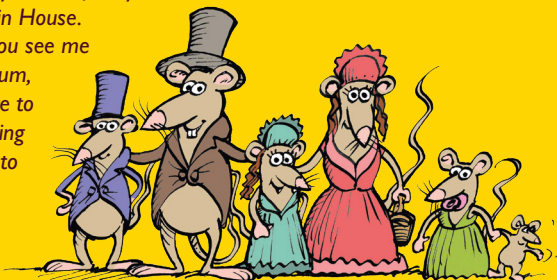
What is special about our museum?

- Rooms that are ordered thematically rather than chronologically (with the exception of the “Space and Time” section, which provides a quick overview of Kempten's different sites and historical landmarks)
- Interactive media and participation points
- A 9 m² model of the city in 3D, with an audiovisual show on the history of Kempten
- Colour-coded rooms focusing on different themes
- “Today Objects” in all the rooms, bringing the present day into the museum
- Exhibits from the Roman era
- Audio stations, where actors bring our historical figures to life
- An emphasis on participation: Kempten residents put their own topics on display in the Citizens' Centre.

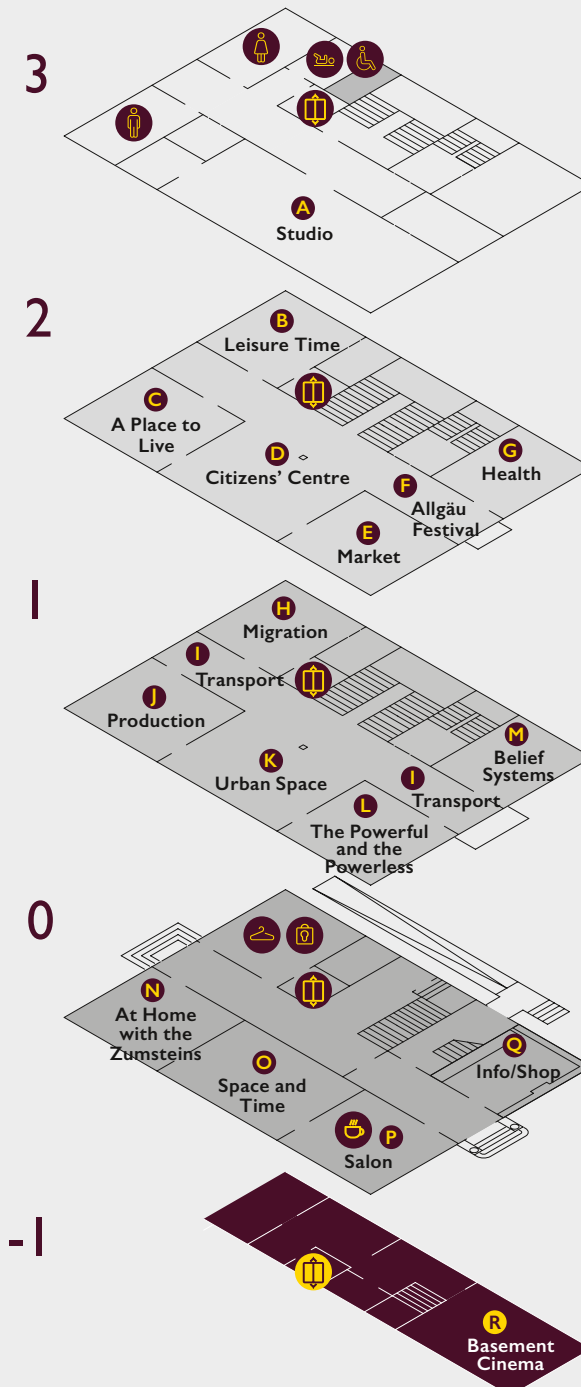

- E** **Market** For over 2,000 years, a place for trading farm animals and goods from near and far
- F** **Allgäu Festival** Historical festival posters, photos, and newspaper articles
- G** **Health** Historical court apothecary / The last barber-surgeon / Contemporary natural remedies
- 1** **H** **Migration** Film portraits of various people who have made Kempten their new home

- O** **Space and Time** The 100 most important events in the history of the city / A map of the city you can walk on, showing its most important attractions
